

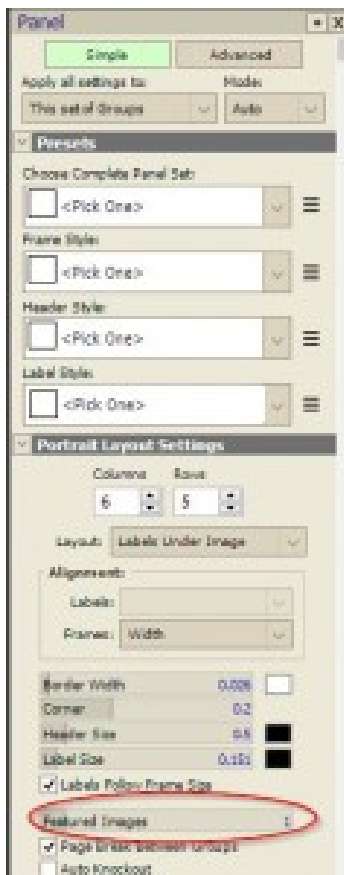
How do I make the teacher's portrait larger than the students?

Date : September 21, 2015

First, ensure that your panel flow places the teacher(s) at the front of their panel. This is done using the [Priority field](#), which breaks alphabetical order, or most efficiently by using the [Make Into](#) feature in the Organizer.

The first frame(s) in a panel are made larger by using the **Featured** image option in the Panel hover.

In **Simple** panel mode, Featured is found here, in the Portrait Layout Settings drawer:



On the **Advanced** tab, Features is found under **Grid**, in the **Portrait Grid Settings** section.

Set the number of images you'd like to enlarge on your panel. The featured frames will fill a 2x2 spot in the panel.

Features = 1 will enlarge the first image in the panel, Features = 2 will enlarge the first two images in the panel, etc.
